I am on afternoon shift now (from 4 P.M. to 12 mid night). it is a good shift for some fellows but not me, because I can't sleep after the sun comes up in the morning.

The basement is dug for the house; we have been hauling gravel for cement, and getting the brakes on the truck lined so we will be able to get some lumber soon as the saw mill opens.

Mawin and Stan followed a poor example that I set and got a ford. Stan is a coach (30) model. Mawin is a coupe (30).

Sunday I worked day shift, then went to Stake Conference with my father at night. They preached on the value of a mission so strong in that session

and the six others that my father attended
that he is as convinced as you and I
