You are broad minded enough to understand why I am am not coming up, and have a constitution strong enough

to stand the disappointment. It is hard for
me to stand up under the the excitement, heat
and disappointment, but I can do it if anyone
can.

Well I have said plenty for this time
so I will hear from you in a few days.

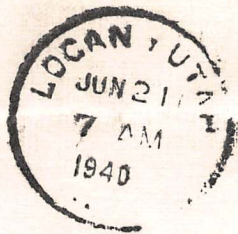
