Dear Estine,

I received one of your most welcome letters today and was glad to hear that you had had an enjoyable visit at Dayton last week end. We will drive up to the (town or City?) when we have a chance to be together for a day or so.

Since we have been moving the plot ~~some~~ everyone is working irregular hours. Sunday I worked from 4 P.M. to 2 A.M. - Monday 9 A.M. to 7 P.M. - Tuesday 5 A.M. to 6 P.M.; tomorrow they want me to report for work at 4 A.M. Friday, however, we will be on our regular schedule, so it makes little difference how many hours I work because they ~~work~~ <sup>pay for</sup> the hours worked.

I done a lot of celebrating on the 24th. I slept until 10 A.M. then wrote letters until time for work at 4 P.M. then drove out for 8 hours.

There is only one girl home now because Ella is visiting with her grandmother at Provo. Things are sure guess when she isn't here to pull jokes on me.

Estine, thank for the invitation to see you any time soon; I will see you soon as I have a day off or sooner. I hope you will accept the invitation to come out here in the near future.

It is now time to bid the sweetest girl in the  
world good night with our loads of love and appreciation
