Now I feel ready to begin the 12 hour shift that I must work to pay for the day off last Sunday, but I would work 12 hours every day if I could see you often.

Dad had some wheat for me to haul so I hauled wheat for 4 hours this morning.

All my folks are happy especially Alma & Dick. Dick found him a job in Murray with a construction Contractor, Alma's application for a nurse has been accepted. she is happy as a lark.

Dad & Ruth will drive "Henry" into Salt Lake Friday night to meet you if you still are coming.

It is time for work so I will sign off with lots of love and appreciation for you and your kindness to me.
