a good heavy over coat and his red flannel.  
Companion says that I am the coldest "guy"  
that he has ever slept with. Day & when

a good pair of ice bricks gets close to him there is plenty of noise & uproar — The feet don't feel cold until they are close to him then a distinct change is noticed.

This week has been more or less our slack week in so much as actual work is concerned but really it seems that we have been meeting a few good folks and presenting a portion of the Gospel to them.

Our Primary seems to be coming along fine. 4 weeks ago I was attending this week there was 15 attending & 20 on roll so you can see that there are many who are enthused over the Program or something because only 3 are children of members — One quite little girl age  $4\frac{1}{2}$



has us call for her & take her home - she  
acts & talks like a kid of 8 or 10, her  
coloring is excellent & takes part like  
the ones who have gone to school 2 or 3  
years - At home she comb her own hair  
& puts the curlers in so nice & even, also  
she curls her 3 year old sisters hair -  
It seems that the primary is a way to  
"crack the ice" & get into a conversation  
with many of the parents -

Winter is here for spells then  
gone for a spell - for the last 5 or six  
days the mercury hasn't been much  
above 30° F. even at noon & a cold old  
west wind comes along parallel with  
the Musselshell River. That is the  
name of the river I was telling you about  
when I first landed in Roundup -

scheduled with this little girls folks they  
are Members of the Reorganized L. O. S. Church  
& it seems that someday they might be  
intelligent enough to realize that they  
are members of the wrong church - We  
are doing a little now & then to show  
them a few points <sup>of difference between</sup> ~~where~~ their church  
and ours -

because it is 7:30 & our meeting is for  
7:45 or 8 so you can see that we try to  
make ourselves think we are busy even  
if we are not. Good night with lots of  
Love to you and you - Tell Grandma to  
keep smiling and the world will smile back,
