Dear Ethel,

As it is Saturday & I have a few short minutes I will drop a line to you & let you know that I am still happy in the service of the Lord. We have been so busy that I hardly know which end my head is on.

Wednesday when we were trading out on the other side of the river and in a rural section we met some of our friends who were making hay in a field. A boy & his sister. Their father was in the last war and was disabled in some way that has been worse since we is older. now he can't work at all so the son & 2 daughters were in the field.

It was about 10 A.M. when we met their mother & she told us they were in the field so we went out to see them. & before long were helping them. At noon

their mother sent out a bunch then we helped them all afternoon with their work. Was it ever hard on my hands - three big blisters on one + 2 on the other but it was well worth it because we really made friends with the folks. After supper we talked with the father until 9:30 P.M. Was it ever good to be of a service or in the service of the Lord that day.

Friday Morning we received the second letter from our District Pres. for this week. That sounded like something special when we saw it but we never thought of a move. That is what it contained. Companion is leaving Sunday + I am getting a new Companion - so my address will be the same for a day or so at least.

Companion has been ironing

for once more before he leaves. We had an appointment in Nye, Mont. again this week end so we will go up sat. & stay sat. night & back sundy in time to fill a dinner engagement at one of our friends at 5:00 P.M. then finish packing, then catch the 6:18 P.M. bus sundy night -

Companion is about ready to leave for Nye and I have been ready for a while so will sign off for now. Thanks for the picture, letters of last and your love.
