Hello There Wife & Boy —

Well here is the letter I promised for this month - now that I have a few minutes on my hands I'll get that months job done. We road the N & S central rail road to Ogdon. We were allowed a 20 minute rest then we loaded on to the Bamburger & made Japan by about 12:00. At S.L.C we transfered to an Army bus & came to the fort.

First thing we did was marched through the mess line then out & had another physical - just the same as I had when I was here before. Still O.S. for Military service & will probably get in the Army some time before noon on 3<sup>rd</sup> of May.

I am in the Telephone Office there is a few desks - 14 telephone booths - Checker & Chinese checker board - there is a few fellows calling home but most of them are waiting till after seven. They issued us bedding - 1 Sheet 1 Pillow & Case 1 Blanket & a cot. & issues to bed down by 9:30 - My address is yet unknown & when where & all else is unknown to me as yet; but one thing for

sure I'll not receive a ferslow till after the boot  
training in the navy or the same thing in the  
Army.

from what they say we sign up for your pay  
& encurence & all that in one or two days. I  
just heard one boy in the telephone tell his folks that  
he would leave friday -

Well it time to say so long for now with  
car loads of love to you & the boy - - -
