Hello this evening - How is my sweetheart and fine big boy this night. It is now about 10:45.

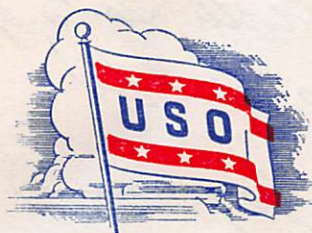
After work this day I did some washing. I washed one pair of garments, 1 pair of Sox, two Handkerchiefs and my work clothing.
