I finished the letter then sat in an easy chair & went to sleep - there was a half dozen flies that bothered me continually but between every-thing I got a few winks of shut eye.

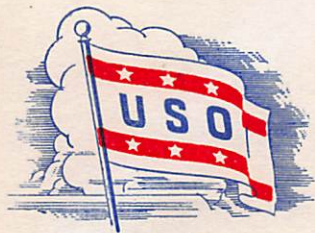
You are probably wondering when I am going to answer your question about the bus connections to Toole - from Dayton Idaho.
