On the Morrow we are booked to fire the rifle for the first time M-1-Rifle - Semi Automatic - It's what a lot of fellows calls a good rifle - I'll find out for my self soon.

You didn't get a letter that I should have written yesterday. I was over in the telephone waiting room again Tuesday night. I called after waiting till 10:00 P.M. & the operator was still working on 6:45 P.M. Call. My call was abt 7:45 so I cancelled it & went up to the barracks & did a few odd jobs - like Shave, Shower, Shine shoes & Sixty Six Sewisere So Socially. Sewed So
