Greetings from this section
of the good old earth this evening.

This evening received another letter
from you. Thanks for the letters you
send - They really do my old soul
good -

This day we have been firing
our M-1 Rifle again. This day
was another day of what they call
jaw ~~bone~~ bone run. Or just
firing to get a little bit used to
the rifle. I fired about 80 rounds
or 4 boxes which amounted to about
\$8⁰⁰ in civilian life. On the Morrow
we are booked up to fire for record.

Also on the morrow they have
me booked up for table waiter.
That will mean that they wish me
out about 3:30 P.M. to ~~go~~ help get
breakfast ready for the company.
That will be good for me though
It will make me appreciate sleeping
till 4:30 on regular days.

This damn life is good for
a lot of things maybe I guess -
but its hard for me to get
used to liking the way we
have to do.

Oh, well one of these week ends
I'll get a chance to go to church
again. Will it ever be good to
look at Dayton Church house walk
again. At that time I know that I

This week has been the longest since I've been in the army. The reason is there is so much waiting to get things done that we have to do.

I am sending some more cabbage leaves this night. \$6.00 tonight. You can put them with the others that I sent.
