you this day or I should
say the old and the letter
that contained my P. Blessing.

sign off with this letter
for tonight. On the morrow
we rise early again the first
time for a week.

We sure have an honest
bunch of fellows in this Barrack.

away.

we'll be back in the good
old city of Logan where I
won't have to worry about
a thing running away.

are in Dayton again no
