

# Party Visits New Temple

IDAHO FALLS — (AP) — Members of the First Presidency of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints from Salt Lake, made a final inspection of the temple in Idaho Falls Thursday preparatory to dedication.

Arriving here Thursday morning from Salt Lake to make the inspection were Pres. George Albert Smith, Pres. J. Reuben Clark Jr., and Pres. David O. McKay. Also here for the inspection were Joseph W. Anderson, secretary to the First Presidency, and Mrs. McKay.

The high Church officials were not available for comment during their stay here but the following statement was released by David Smith, temple president and president of the North Idaho Falls Stake:

"Members of the First Presidency are here for a final inspection of the temple preparatory to the dedication, which date has not been determined at the present time but presumably will be when things are finally ready and conditions lend to its dedication."

The group arrived early Thursday morning and spent the morning inspecting the temple on the east bank of the Snake River. They left to return to Salt Lake Thursday afternoon.

Members of the temple presidency conducting the inspection included David Smith, president; John R. Sayer, first counselor, and Fred Schwendiman, second counselor.
