I heard from your mom this day. She said that she hasn't been in Dayton with your dad for some three years. That is To live - I'll bet it will be a great day for your parents at that time.

Well I suppose you have heard more on the radio than I have - and all I have heard is what has come over the radio. So far we haven't heard a thing except on the radio & that report is that we'll be here in the Spring till those who are veterans of actual battle have been released. That is all who haven't been across will go to relieve those who have been fighting for years. And that is a good

deal no matter how much we
want to get home.

Well all we can do is
live this day and make the
best out of all we have to
do with. Before too many days
Pass we will be able to be together
again.

As I told you in letters before
I am going out to the field
with the Bn. On Manuevers.
We have more of a test and
all that we have had so far
and a review all together. Letters
will be hard to send but I'll
be able to receive all the
letters that come into the
camp. So when you don't hear

from me for a day or so ~~to~~ just
remember that I still love you
and have a longing to see my
Wife and son - and aim to
do my work as well as possible
so that I can be with you soon
as possible.
