Dear Edwin Walter,

Greetings from this side of the  
good old earth again this evening -  
We have had a good rain storm  
most of the day - Now towards  
evening the rain dies down  
and a pleasant fresh smell out  
when you get away from the  
Tobacco smoke.

Friday this day & it is the  
barbers' busiest day of the week -  
we have cut this day - 38 two  
wishes ago for an all time high  
for one day here - I just finished  
cutting the Company Commanders  
hair - I was a little nervous & didn't  
get such good job as I have  
done on some of the other fellows -  
Maybe it will pass for a while who  
knows?

They all pay me in Jap money  
I can sell to cash in a few  
every week & then to the next  
fellows for American money.  
Now that about all of the American  
money is cashed in I suppose  
I'll have to start buying money  
orders - which will be for.

The lights just went out  
and is it ever dark around  
here. The lights from all over the  
area. I suppose I'll have to  
put my tools away and find  
my way to the bed.

Go long sweetheart and  
goodnight. Remember I  
love it
