Time for a short line to extend thanks for the seeds that I received this day - Two letters or envelopes with 8 Packs arrived. Cabbage. Spined turnip-carrot - 2 Radish - Onions & Parsnips -

Thanks Sweetheart Thanks Thanks - Now I have a few more things on my mind so time should start rolling by a little faster.

Yesterday I hitched to Tokyo - Guess what happened? Right I went to I.D.S. church - Only yesterday was extra special. Semi Annual conference. Some 470 attended. fellows from every section of Japan some from the Mainland of Asia and some from the Islands of Hawaii.

And the fellows and girls that I met that I had known some time before - And one of my best acquaintances. A boy from Lakeview. David Smith - He lives the first house from the church house towards dad's place - On the same side of the road as the church - We had an enjoyable afternoon an evening together talking about the rocks we used to throw at each other. You

know some of the rocks we threw at each other we decided were so big that we couldn't lift them. Then the next day we were the best of friends.

Yes Sunday our shifts lined up just right. I worked sat. Midnight to 8 A.M. then went to Tokyo & spent all day & came back - Was still able to get a good night's sleep - before I went on my next shift at 8 A.M. this morning -

This day the mail man brought letters from you - your Mom and from Dad - so far as I am able to tell from the letters everything seems to be running smooth back home both at Dada's place and at your folks place -

Well this letter isn't long but it will carry my love to you again this day and also a reminder that this fellow thinks of you often - I love you Sweetheart -
